North Yorkshire Police Updates

High-value burglary at Sam Turners Ltd in Northallerton

North Yorkshire Police has released CCTV images following a high-value burglary at Sam Turners Ltd in Northallerton.

It happened at around 10.38pm on Tuesday (24 October 2023) when the offenders broke into a unit on the site off the A167 Darlington Road. They made off with various power tools which were loaded onto a heavy goods vehicle with a white tractor unit pulling a blue curtain-sided trailer. The vehicle was seen travelling through Northallerton at 10.08pm on the High Street and at Standard Way near Sam Turners. It appeared again at 11.28pm travelling on the Darlington Road towards Northallerton High Street before going onto the A168 Thirsk Road. Police are interested in any private CCTV, dashcam and doorbell footage in the area at around the time of the incident.



They also want to hear from anyone who may recognise either of the two men in the CCTV images or information regarding the whereabouts of the heavy goods vehicle used in the commercial burglary.

Police and Fire HQ evacuated - statement

The headquarters of North Yorkshire Police and North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service in Northallerton was evacuated at around 1.50pm on the afternoon of Friday 27 October.

In good faith, a member of the public handed a box of what were believed to be grenades, found during a house clearance, into the police station reception.

North Yorkshire Police evacuated the building, put a cordon in place to protect staff and members of the public, and contacted the Army's Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Team.

The EOD Team arrived and removed the items, and staff were able to return to the building. No-one was injured during the incident that concluded at around 3.45pm.
